IN RE: BAIL SCHEDULE

Pursuant to Sonoma County Superior Court Local Rule 8.14, Government Code section 68115, and the authority granted by the Judicial Council of California, the Sonoma County Superior Court Executive Committee approves to extend the Emergency Bail Schedule previously ordered until further order of the Presiding Judge. For convenience the Rule and Bail Schedule are set forth hereinbelow.

## Sonoma County Superior Court Emergency Bail Schedule

#### (a) Purpose

Notwithstanding any other law, this rule establishes an Emergency Bail Schedule, which is intended to promulgate uniformity in the handling of certain offenses during the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic in the County of Sonoma.

## (b) Mandatory application

This bail schedule shall apply:

(1) To every accused person arrested and in pretrial custody.

## (2) To every accused person held in pretrial custody.

## (c) Setting of bail and exceptions

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Under this Emergency Bail Schedule, bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses shall be set at \$0, with the exception of only the offenses listed below:

- A serious felony, as defined in Penal Code section 192.7(c), or a violent felony, as defined in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
- (2) <u>A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;</u>
- (3) <u>A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);</u>
- (4) <u>A violation of Penal Code section 136.1 when punishment is imposed under</u> section 136.1(c);
- (5) <u>A violation of Penal Code section 262;</u>
- (6) A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
- (7) <u>A violation of Penal Code section 273.6 if the detained person made threats to kill or harm, has engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the protected party;</u>
- <u>A violation of Penal Code section 422 where the offense is punished as a</u> felony;
- (9) <u>A violation of Penal Code section 646.9;</u>
- (10) A violation of an offense listed in Penal Code section 290(c);
- (11) A violation of Vehicle Code sections 23152 or 23153;
- (12) A felony violation of Penal Code section 463; and
- (13) A violation of Penal Code section 29800.

# (d) Ability to deny bail

Nothing in the Emergency Bail Schedule restricts the ability of the court to deny bail as authorized by article I, section 12, or 28(f)(3) of the California Constitution.

	supervision terms and conditions, and that person is arrested for a new off
